LiveHealth provides 24/7 access to doctors at no cost to you. (During a visit, after you select a physical and enter your Anthem ID number, you will see the original cost change to \$0.) Use LiveHealth Online for common health concerns like colds, the flu, fevers, rashes, infections and allergies. Prescriptions sent to your pharmacy, if needed. It's faster, easier and more convenient than a visit to an urgent care center. Don't wait until you or your family get sick. Sign up for LiveHealth Online today at LiveHealthonline.com or download the app to your mobile device.

IT CAN SAVE YOU MONEY, IT'S ALWAYS YOUR DECISION, AND IT'S EASY

As a KEHP member, you can save money when you shop for your next medical procedure or test and earn a cash reward of up to \$500, for the choices you make. When your doctor recommends a preventative screening, medical procedure or diagnostic test that is on the list of services under the Vitals Smart Shopper program, visit vitalssmartshopper.com. Shop your service and receive information on high-quality, cost effective service providers in your area. If you plan to have medical services performed outside of your home area, you will need to call Vitals. Their staff will conduct a specialized search and provide you with the appropriate options. The process takes less than two minutes, and all you need is your member number from your Anthem ID card. If you shop with Vitals and use a cost-effective location, you will receive a reward check in the mail within 45-60 days of your claim being paid. To qualify for a financial incentive reward, you must shop your procedure with Vitals at least 24 hours prior to your service.
